FIRST READING

2 Kings 5:1-3, 7-15c

In the Bible, leprosy included anything from superficial skin conditions to the terribly debilitating Hansen's Disease. Society in Biblical times did not know the scientific explanation for the spread of infectious diseases. They did know that some diseases spread, and the results could be wide-spread and deadly. Today we see one of the great Old Testament prophets, Elisha. The setting of the story is territorial conflict—not unlike in today's world. We see the pretense of power and we see innocent trust.

Naaman, commander of the army of the king of Aram, was a great man and in high favor with his master, because by him the Lord had given victory to Aram. The man, though a mighty warrior, suffered from leprosy. ²Now the Arameans on one of their raids had taken a young girl captive from the land of Israel, and she served Naaman's wife. ³She said to her mistress, "If only my lord were with the prophet who is in Samaria! He would cure him of his leprosy." ⁷When the king of Israel read the letter, he tore his clothes and said, "Am I God, to give death or life, that this man sends word to me to cure a man of his leprosy? Just look and see how he is trying to pick a quarrel with me."


⁸But when Elisha the man of God heard that the king of Israel had torn his clothes, he sent a message to the king, "Why have you torn your clothes? Let him come to me, that he may learn that there is a prophet in Israel." ⁹So Naaman came with his horses and chariots, and halted at the entrance of Elisha's house. ¹⁰Elisha sent a messenger to him, saying, "Go, wash in the Jordan seven times, and your flesh shall be restored and you shall be clean." ¹¹But Naaman became angry and went away, saying, "I thought that for me he would surely come out, and stand and call on the name of the Lord his God, and would wave his hand over the spot, and cure the leprosy! ¹²Are not Abana and Pharpar, the rivers of Damascus, better than all the waters of Israel? Could I not wash in them, and be clean?" He turned and went away in a rage. ¹³But his servants approached and said to him, "Father, if the prophet had commanded you to do something difficult, would you not have done it? How much more, when all he said to you was, 'Wash, and be clean'?" ¹⁴So he went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, according to the word of the man of God; his flesh was restored like the flesh of a young boy, and he was clean.

^{15a-c}Then he returned to the man of God, he and all his company; he came and stood before him and said, "Now I know that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel."

SECOND READING

2 Timothy 2:8-15

Though Paul is chained as a prisoner, he reminds Timothy that the word of God is never shackled or confined. He encourages his young friend to proclaim that word of freedom in an honest and upright life as well as in his teaching and preaching.

Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David—that is my gospel,⁹ for which I suffer hardship, even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained.¹⁰ Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, so that they may also obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory.¹¹ The saying is sure:

If we have died with him, we will also live with him;

¹²if we endure, we will also reign with him; if we deny him, he will also deny us;

¹³if we are faithless, he remains faithful—for he cannot deny himself.

¹⁴Remind them of this, and warn them before God that they are to avoid wrangling over words, which does no good but only ruins those who are listening.¹⁵ Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved by him, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly explaining the word of truth.

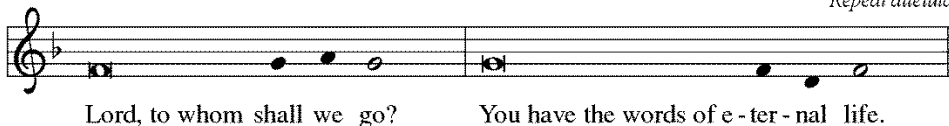

GOSPEL

Luke 17:11-19

Jesus' mission of salvation included making the unclean clean—in personal life and in connections of society. The action Jesus prescribes here follows the Old Testament ritual described in Leviticus 13 and 14. The ritual takes an unexpected turn. One, who was also an outcaste due to his ethnic origin, becomes a model for complete healing.

On the way to Jerusalem Jesus was going through the region between Samaria and Galilee.¹² As he entered a village, ten lepers approached him. Keeping their distance,¹³ they called out, saying, “Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!”¹⁴ When he saw them, he said to them, “Go and show yourselves to the priests.” And as they went, they were made clean.¹⁵ Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice.¹⁶ He prostrated himself at Jesus’ feet and thanked him. And he was a Samaritan.¹⁷ Then Jesus asked, “Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they?”¹⁸ Was none of them found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?”¹⁹ Then he said to him, “Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well.”

SAY, PRAY, AND BLESS:

CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your household or small group:

- What are you thankful for? Why?
- Do you think of yourself as a grateful person?
- In the story of the ten lepers (Luke 17:11-19), all ten were healed. Jesus said that the one who returned to give thanks was made well. What does it mean that giving thanks makes you well?

DEVOTIONS

When Jesus healed 10 lepers, only one returned to give him thanks. (Luke 17:11-19). As God's people, we are called to count our blessings each day and give thanks to God. Talk together about people, events, and experiences for which you can and should give thanks. Use this acrostic of the word

THANKS to guide you:

Thank God for ... A **T**hing provided; A **H**elp received; **A**nother's company; an **e**njoyable moment; a **K**indness received; and a **S**urprise enjoyed.

Finish your conversation by giving thanks in prayer.

SERVICE

Only one of the 10 lepers healed returned to thank Jesus. There are many people who serve us in various ways in our communities—in schools, churches, community organizations, and service industries—who receive little gratitude for what they do. Prepare a thank you card or gift (such as a plate of cookies) to give to someone who regularly serves your household in some way (such as a postal delivery person, a policeman, a school teacher). Give thanks to God for him/her in your prayers this week.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

An attitude of gratitude is important to the life of faith. This week, when people ask how you are doing, make it a point to respond, **"I am grateful."** See if this can be an ongoing attitude and response.
