
**N**ow we command you, beloved, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from believers who are living in idleness and not according to the tradition that they received from us.  
<sup>7</sup>For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not idle when we were with you,  
<sup>8</sup>and we did not eat anyone's bread without paying for it; but with toil and labor we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you. <sup>9</sup>This was not because we do not have that right, but in order to give you an example to imitate. <sup>10</sup>For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: Anyone unwilling to work should not eat. <sup>11</sup>For we hear that some of you are living in idleness, mere busybodies, not doing any work. <sup>12</sup>Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living. <sup>13</sup>Brothers and sisters, do not be weary in doing what is right.



## GOSPEL

Luke 21:5-19

*As history moves toward God's fulfillment there will be frightening signs and events. Before the end, believers will draw strength from their relationship to God and shall be given the words they need to testify and to endure without fear.*

**W**hen some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, [Jesus] said, <sup>6</sup>“As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down.”

<sup>7</sup>They asked him, “Teacher, when will this be, and what will be the sign that this is about to take place?” <sup>8</sup>And he said, “Beware that you are not led astray; for many will come in my name and say, ‘I am he!’ and, ‘The time is near!’ Do not go after them.

<sup>9</sup>“When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately.” <sup>10</sup>Then he said to them, “Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; <sup>11</sup>there will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and plagues; and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven.

<sup>12</sup>“But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name.

<sup>13</sup>This will give you an opportunity to testify. <sup>14</sup>So make up your minds not to prepare your defense in advance;

<sup>15</sup>for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. <sup>16</sup>You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death. <sup>17</sup>You will be hated by all because of my name. <sup>18</sup>But not a hair of your head will perish. <sup>19</sup>By your endurance you will gain your souls.”

presence in Holy Communion are invited to commune at the Lord's Table today. Children not yet communing will receive a blessing. Ushers will direct you. Communion is by intinction: you will receive the Host in your hand; you may then dip the Host into the chalice. It is the understanding of the universal Church that those who wish to commune with bread only (especially for health reasons) have communed fully.

#### CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your household or small group:

- Talk about a difficult time you have experienced.
- The prophets of the Old Testament as well as Jesus knew that our faith would be tested through difficult times. Talk about how God has been with you during tough times.
- In Luke 21:5-19, Jesus says that his followers will experience trials and persecution. How has enduring a difficult time been a witness to your faith?

#### DEVOTIONS

Luke 21:13 states that life's difficulties will give Jesus' followers an opportunity to talk about their faith. Tell family and friends a faith story from your life that involved enduring a difficult time. Offer a prayer of thanksgiving for the work of the Holy Spirit that sustained you during that experience.

#### SERVICE

In Luke 21, Jesus warns that some Christians will face persecution because they follow him. This is still the case today in various parts of the world. Pray this week for all Christians that are persecuted for their faith. Here are some current examples:

- **Christians in North Korea:** In this country, following Jesus is considered an act of treason, and Christians face the real threat of imprisonment and even execution.
- **Christians in Sudan, Egypt, Nigeria, Iraq, India, Pakistan, and various parts of Indonesia:** Many Christians in these areas live in fear of being physically attacked by followers of other religions.
- **Christians in China:** House churches in China face the constant threat of raids from government authorities who have imprisoned many church leaders.

#### RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

Recite Psalm 98. After each verse say:
