

FIFTH SUNDAY after EPIPHANY



Light shines in the darkness for the upright, the psalmist sings. Isaiah declares that when we loose the bonds of injustice and share our bread with the hungry, the light breaks forth like the dawn. In another passage from the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus, the light of the world, calls his followers to let the light of their good works shine before others. Through baptism we are sent into the world to shine with the light of Christ.



FIRST READING Isaiah 58:1-9a

Shortly after the return of Israel from exile in Babylon, the people were troubled by the ineffectiveness of their fasts. God reminds them that outward observance is no substitute for genuine fasting that results in acts of justice, such as feeding the hungry, sheltering the homeless, and clothing the naked.

SECOND READING 1 Corinthians 2:1-12

Though people such as the Corinthians are enamored with human philosophy and wisdom, Paul continuously presents God's hidden wisdom which is Jesus Christ crucified. True spiritual maturity involves judging ourselves and others in light of God's revelation in the cross.

hen I came to you, brothers and sisters, I did not come proclaiming the mystery of God to you in lofty words or wisdom. ²For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified. ³And I came to you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling. ⁴My speech and my proclamation were not with plausible words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of the Spirit and of power, ⁵so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God.

⁶Yet among the mature we do speak wisdom, though it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to perish. ⁷But we speak God's wisdom, secret and hidden, which God decreed before the ages for our glory. ⁸None of the rulers of this age understood this; for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. ⁹But, as it is written.

"What no eye has seen, nor ear heard,

nor the human heart conceived,

what God has prepared for those who love him"-


¹⁰these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit; for the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. ¹¹For what human being knows what is truly human except the human spirit that is within? So also no one comprehends what is truly God's except the Spirit of God. ¹²Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit that is from God, so that we may understand the gifts bestowed on us by God.

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus encourages his followers to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world, doing good works and keeping God's commandments.

Jesus said: ¹³"You are the salt of the earth; but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything, but is thrown out and trampled under foot.

¹⁴"You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. ¹⁵No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. ¹⁶In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to

your Father in heaven.

¹⁷"Do not think that I have come to abolish the law or the prophets; I have come not to abolish but to fulfill. ¹⁸For truly I tell you, until heaven and earth pass away, not one letter, not one stroke of a letter, will pass from the law until all is accomplished. ¹⁹Therefore, whoever breaks one of the least of these commandments, and teaches others to do the same, will be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. ²⁰For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven."







Communion is by intinction: you will receive the Host in your hand; you may then dip the Host into the chalice. It is the understanding of the universal Church that those who wish to commune with bread only (especially for health reasons) have communed fully.



SCRIPTURE VERSE FOR THIS WEEK

"Make your light shine, so that others will see the good that you do and will praise your Father in heaven." **Matthew 5:16 (CEV)**

PRAYERS AND BLESSING:

A Prayer for the Week:

Lord God, be our light when darkness surrounds us. Shine over us, in us, and through us. Amen.

Mealtime Prayer:

Jesus our Savior, thank you for this food, so full of flavor. Jesus our Light, may we shine for you, with love so bright. Amen.

A Blessing to Give:

May the Spirit of Christ give light to your life and shine before others, so that others may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven. (Matthew 5:16)

CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your home or small group:

- Reflect on a time you were in a dark place and needed light to help you.
- In Matthew 5:13-20, Jesus points out that his disciples make a positive difference in the world. How is Christian behavior based on wisdom that is not like the wisdom of the world (1 Corinthians 2:1-12)?
- Tell about someone whose life has helped you see God in the world?

DEVOTIONS

Read Matthew 5:13-20 using a simple form of *lectio divina* (divine reading). Read the text two times slowly, pausing after each reading. Choose a word or phrase from the text that gets your attention. Focus on that word or phrase for awhile. Then read the text again and wonder how the message connects with your life today. Read the passage a fourth time and spend some time reflecting on how this passage might direct your life to some action in the next few days. Conclude with a prayer giving thanks for the words of Jesus to be light and salt to the world.

SERVICE

Read Isaiah 58:6-8. The prophet describes the people of God as light shining in the world through human activity that focuses on the care of others. The examples include feeding the hungry, caring for the homeless, treating others with kindness, and showing hospitality. Commit to some specific act of kindness during the week or financially support an organization that offers help to those in need.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

With your household or a small group, use the following lighting service at the beginning of a meal, Bible study, or prayer group. [Light one or more candles and say the following]

Leader: We give thanks that Jesus Christ is the light of the world.

All: The light no darkness can overcome.

Leader: Let our lights shine before others.

All: That others may see our good works and give glory to God.

Conclude by singing This Little Light of Mine.
