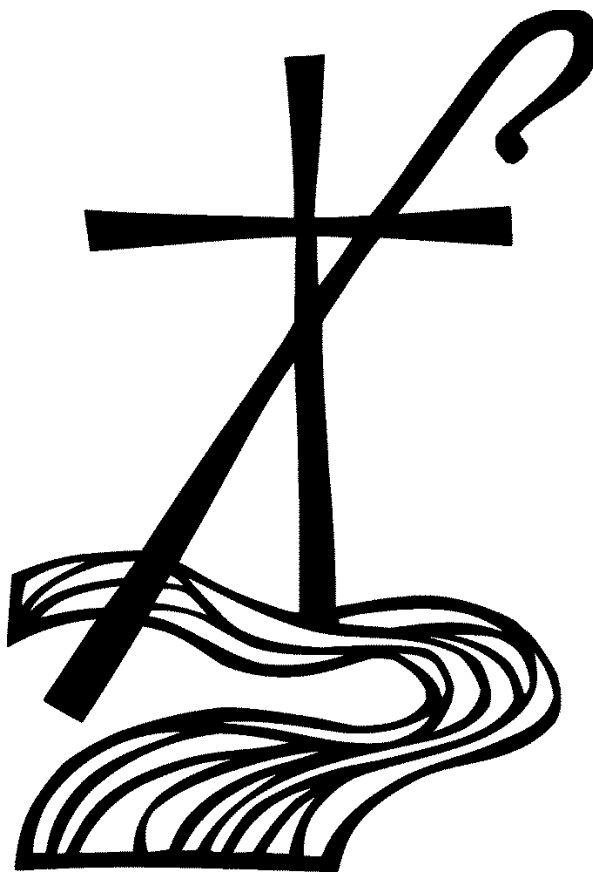





CARING CONVERSATIONS

DEVOTIONS

Read: Matthew 25:1-13.

Since the time of the New Testament church, there has been a concern to keep the faith alive and "burning" while waiting for Christ's return. We can become complacent and lose the sense of urgency about actively living the Christian faith everyday. In Amos 5:18-24 the prophet pointed out that God was not pleased with a worship life that did not show itself in acts of justice and fairness. Reflect on how the Christian faith matters every day. Pray the following prayer:

Dear God, give me a living faith that seeks to please you with love, fairness, and care for others each day. Amen

Close with the Lord's Prayer.

SERVICE

The biblical theme of justice is closely associated with care for those in need, especially the poor. Take time this week to do some act of service for someone in need. See your action as a way to say, "Yes," to the justice and fairness of God in the world.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

Reflect this week on how each day in the life of faith matters. Light a candle in remembrance of the parable of the wise and foolish girls. Sing or pray the "Hymn of the Week", *Give Me Oil in My Lamp*. Take time to read Scripture, pray, and care for the needs of others.
