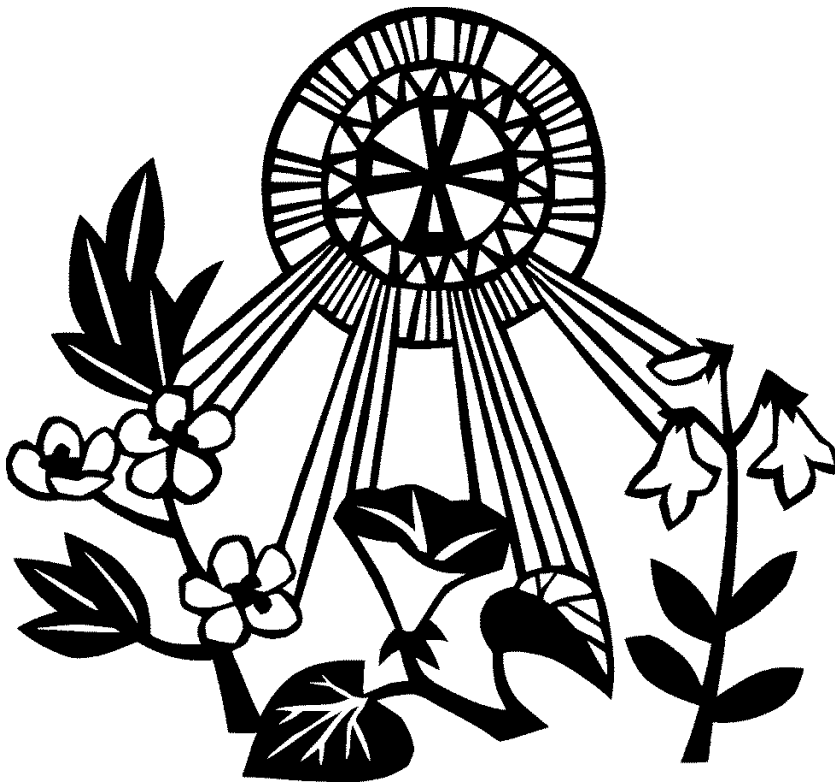

SIXTH SUNDAY of EASTER



"Where are we going?" ...the child asks as the family scrambles to the car. ... the young adult (or the parents of) ask at graduation time. ...the adult asks as the number of remaining years diminishes. ...a society asks, because things just are not the same as we expect, as we remember, as we try to remember what we had expected.

In the cycle of the Church year, based on the life and ministry of Jesus, we are advancing from Resurrection to Ascension. Our readings challenge us to ask, for myself personally, for us as congregation, community and, indeed, for all humanity: Are we walking with our Lord Jesus into God's preferred and promised future, the destination, the destiny God has prepared for us?



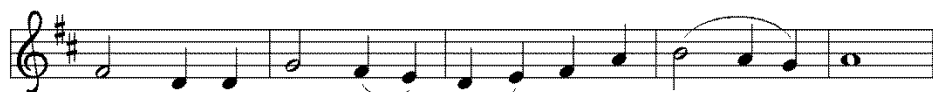

FIRST READING

Acts 17:22-31

We continue reading in the Acts of the Apostles – we could also call this the Acts of the Holy Spirit. The Areopagus in ancient Athens was viewed as the epitome of human knowledge. The Holy Spirit has led the Apostle Paul to this place and has opened his eyes to the many ways humans try to secure their view of the future, for that is what a god is really. He appeals to a common, human sense of origin and destiny, quoting their own poets. The verses following this section tell us that when he talked about Resurrection some scoffed. Other indicated they might be willing to hear more. Writing about this encounter, St. Luke had said, perhaps with a bit of sarcasm, that “the Athenians and the foreigners living there would spend their time in nothing but telling or hearing something new.” When are we too close-minded? When are we called, with open-minds, to make a commitment? What was Saint Paul’s assessment of this experience? “... for God’s foolishness is wiser than human wisdom...” 1 Corinthians 1:18-25.

Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, “Athenians, I see how extremely religious you are in every way. ²³For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, ‘To an unknown god.’ What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. ²⁴The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, ²⁵nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things. ²⁶From one ancestor he made all nations to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, ²⁷so that they would search for God and perhaps grope for him and find him—though indeed he is not far from each one of us. ²⁸For ‘In him we live and move and have our being’; as even some of your own poets have said,

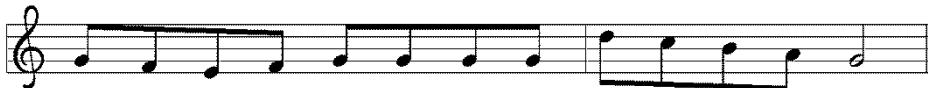
‘For we too are his offspring.’

²⁹Since we are God’s offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like gold, or silver, or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of mortals. ³⁰While God has overlooked the times of human ignorance, now he commands all people everywhere to repent, ³¹because he has fixed a day on which he will have the world judged in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed, and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead.”

SECOND READING

1 Peter 3:13-22

Does God inflict suffering? The phrase, “if suffering should be God’s will”, raises so many questions. But what is really going on when we do what is right yet everything turns out wrong? The Apostle is writing to people who want to follow Christ’s Way. Yet for whatever reason, they are in some way suffering because of it. The message of Cross and Resurrection promises, that while humans may intend to inflict suffering, God is able to, and desires to, transform suffering into a life giving experience.

Who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good? ¹⁴But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, ¹⁵but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you; ¹⁶yet do it with gentleness and reverence. Keep your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who abuse you for your good conduct in Christ may be put to shame. ¹⁷For it is better to suffer for doing good, if suffering should be God’s will, than to suffer for doing evil. ¹⁸For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, ¹⁹in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, ²⁰who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water. ²¹And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, ²²who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

GOSPEL

John 14:15-21

We are reading Jesus' words, given to his disciples the night before his crucifixion, sort of like a farewell address. The Gospel of John does not conclude with a final earthly appearance or with the Ascension. It is almost as if Crucifixion, Resurrection, Ascension are one (see John 12:31-32). Thus, we can hear these words from Jesus as addressed to all his followers, in all times and in all places, including us.

Jesus said to the disciples: ¹⁵"If you love me, you will keep my commandments. ¹⁶And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you forever. ¹⁷This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you.

¹⁸"I will not leave you orphaned; I am coming to you. ¹⁹In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me; because I live, you also will live. ²⁰On that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you. ²¹They who have my commandments and keep them are those who love me; and those who love me will be loved by my Father, and I will love them and reveal myself to them."

CARING CONVERSATIONS

Discuss in your home or small group:

- Who has been helpful to you? In what ways have you been of help to others?
- In John 14 Jesus promises the Holy Spirit who is called the Helper or Counselor, one who would walk with Jesus’ followers. How does the Spirit walk with you so that you may believe in Jesus?
- How would you like the Holy Spirit to help you today?

DEVOTIONS

Read: Acts 17:22-31.

Paul is in Athens speaking to people who do not know Jesus. Paul addresses them by connecting with the Greek culture he sees around him. He commends them for their search for God. He quotes Greek poetry to connect his message with their longings for God. The Christian faith has always been a world religion that seeks to connect with local languages and cultures to communicate the good news of Jesus Christ. From its beginnings, the message of the gospel has been translated from the language of the Old Testament (Hebrew) and the language of Jesus (Aramaic). It is a humbling and demanding challenge to communicate the gospel into contemporary languages and cultures. Reflect on how you share your faith in today’s world. Pray for the work of the church to speak and work faithfully with the many cultures of the world.

SERVICE

Jesus told his disciples, “I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you” (John 14:18). Think about those around you, whether at school, work, neighborhood, or home, who may feel alone. Reach out to them with love and care.

RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

This Thursday (May 25) is Ascension Day. It is the fortieth day after Easter Sunday and always falls on a Thursday. This day marks the last appearance of Jesus to the disciples after his resurrection. In Acts 1:9 it states that Jesus ascended into a cloud. Clouds represent a biblical image for the presence of God. Go outside to see if there are any clouds. If so, notice what shapes you can find. There is an old tradition that the clouds on Ascension Day take the form of lambs, in honor of the Lamb of God. Say these words,

“Jesus has ascended, but he will return! Come, Lord Jesus, Come!”.
