

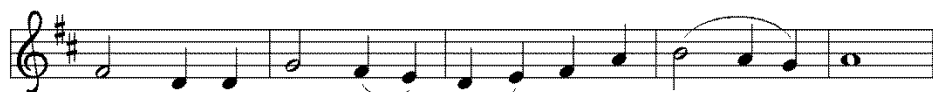



**John 17:1-11**

*On the night before his crucifixion, Jesus prays to his heavenly Father, asking that those who continue his work in this world will live in unity.*

**A**fter Jesus had spoken these words [to his disciples], he looked up to heaven and said, “Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son so that the Son may glorify you, <sup>2</sup>since you have given him authority over all people, to give eternal life to all whom you have given him. <sup>3</sup>And this is eternal life, that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. <sup>4</sup>I glorified you on earth by finishing the work that you gave me to do. <sup>5</sup>So now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had in your presence before the world existed.

### DEVOTIONS

Before Jesus was arrested, he prayed especially for his disciples, his closest friends during his time on earth (John 17:6-11). He prayed that God would protect them, and that they would be united. In today's world it is especially important that the church emphasize what unites us in our witness of Jesus to the world instead of what divides us. Be open to learn from Christians not from your own tradition. Pray for our Christian brothers and sisters in your community as well as across the globe, especially for those who are persecuted for their faith.

It is often forgotten that many Christians around the globe suffer for their faith, especially in parts of Africa and the Middle East. Pray for those who suffer and advocate to your politicians for just actions in the world. Consider a financial contribution to church efforts that support Christians who experience persecution.

### RITUALS AND TRADITIONS

Ascension Day is preparation for Pentecost and the coming of the Holy Spirit. The nine days between Ascension Day and Pentecost are referred to as the *novena* (Latin for nine) and is used as a time to join Christians in prayer as the church awaits the giving of the Holy Spirit. In 1 Peter 5:7 it reads, "God cares for you, so turn all your worries over to him." From now until next Sunday, Pentecost Sunday, name the things you worry about then pray, "Come, Holy Spirit, come."
