### From Our Presiding Bishop

Getting a phone call in the middle of the night is never a good thing. I remember the second time my father had open-heart surgery. It was a long procedure and a difficult one, and after it was done the doctor called us to his office and said, "There's been some bleeding. We'll let you know, but you should go home now and rest." And so going home that night, I listened for a phone call in the middle of the night and was awakened only to find out it was morning and it was birds singing, not the phone ringing. My father had made it through the night, and in fact he did recover from the surgery.

This is the joy we feel at Easter, but magnified. All of the hope that had been dashed on Good Friday, the terrible pressure of grief, the terrible pressure of knowing there was no future in the world, only on Sunday to be greeted not by the ringing of a telephone announcing death but the loud clear singing of alleluias. This is the joy we have, and it's a promise so strong that even when we do die, even when we do confront death, we have the hope and the assurance of eternal life.

Easter makes it possible for us, even at the grave, to sing alleluia. Christ is risen! Alleluia! Happy Easter, dear church!



# NEWS & Notes...



March 19, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 PM. The agenda was accepted. Minutes of the February meeting were reviewed and accepted.

The Treasurer's Report was unanimously accepted. Staff reports were reviewed and accepted.

The National Lutheran Choir performance on March 4 was the best choral concert Pr. Roynesdal has attended.

The next Christian Education meeting is March 21. Information about the upcoming day camp with Camp Carol Joy Holling is circulating.

Media/Technology: the time change on March 10 caused issues in televising that morning's worship service.

Property Committee: `about a third of the sanctuary ceiling work is completed. We have dipped into the MIF to help defray costs. The company with which we've been talking to regarding the windows has advised on going with vinyl plastic instead of wood which looks good. We've asked for a bid but as yet have not received one. Repairing the false beams in the sanctuary is the next step. Scaffolding will be required. This work could probably be done in July.

Global Mission has not yet met this year. A Trip to Tanzania is being explored with Carol Stoltenberg, through MOSAIC.

Outreach: One new person is attending the new member class. We will have an Easter ad in the Omaha World-Herald's special section on April 14.

Social Ministry: First United Methodist would like their youth to participate in LYSO. First United Methodist is also putting together a "Box City" event to draw attention

to homelessness in our community. Friends and Family dinner is May 5.

Worship and Music: Is looking into the possibility of Adult Forum being recorded or broadcast via the web.

Youth: Presentation for graduating seniors is underway.

Endowment Board: With the departure of Steve Jacobson, we do not have a Council representative on the Endowment Board. Pr. Roynesdal will ask Rick Kolkmann and make other inquiries.

A task force has been assembled for the new pictorial directory.

Bob Fonda presented insurance policy changes related to Kountze Commons and KMLC. The changes were moved, seconded, and unanimously approved.

We welcome Steve Urlaub as the newest member of the KMLC Council. Steve has been assigned to the Congregational Activities committee. Scott Henneman was elected as the new vice president of the KMLC Council.

Our new Ministry Site Profile is posted.

Synod Assembly will be in Kearney this year. We are looking for five to seven voting members to attend.

KMLC will sponsor a table and find people interested in attending the Camp Carol Joy Holling Benefit

KMLC will look into sponsoring a table at the UNL Lutheran Center Benefit to help this ministry.

There was a discussion on the debt repayment options on Kountze Commons. More to come in the April meeting.

Joyce Palmer has resigned her leadership at the food pantry. She will stay on at the Healing Gift Free Clinic. We will find a temporary replacement.

There being no further business to come before the Council, the Council unanimously voted to adjourn, with the Lord's Prayer at 7:09 PM.

The next regular KMLC Council meeting is April 16, 2019, at  $6:00\ PM$ .

### **Call Committee Begins Work**

The Call Committee for a new Associate Pastor has begun its work. Committee members are:



Tim Backora, Chair; Charlie Campbell, Karen Fannin, Mike Jensen (council), Britten Johnson, Jean Johnson, Anna Kidder, Ann Miller (council), Jacob Rump, Ken Wise, and Pastor Olaf Roynesdal. They will be formally installed on May 18/19.

The Committee met with Pastor Juliet Hampton from the Nebraska Synod ELCA on April 3. She outlined the procedures for the call process. The committee met again on April 11 and April 23 to fine-tune our Ministry Profile and to begin formulating interview questions. A description of the pastoral position is now on the ELCA website and can be accessed by any pastor of the ELCA.

Bishop Brian Maas of Nebraska Synod will be meeting with the committee as his schedule permits.

Please keep the important work of this committee in your prayers. Updates will be published as things progress.

### **Property Updates**

- We will be will be sealing cracks and replacing one panel of the concrete parking lot as a part of the ongoing maintenance of the facility.
- The Landscaping & Art Work Committee for Kountze Commons will be installing a landscape mural on the west wall of the Commons Link that will highlight our mission: welcoming, serving, growing. The NW stairway window of our new facility will have a photo applied image of Christ with open hands (One hand with a loaf of bread to symbolize the Food Pantry and the other hand with a medical theme item to be determined).
- An area inlet with a below grade drain line to the existing area inlet in the Garden Area has been installed. This will eliminate the water and ice problem we were experiencing with the existing Church roof drain
- The Healing Gift Free Clinic has been renamed to **The Del & Lou Ann Weber Free Clinic.**
- Wall protection chair rail materials have been installed in the Link and Clinic Lobby Area.
- It is anticipated that the sanctuary structural repairs will be completed by June.
- There will be an additional cost to repair and support the Sanctuary wood trim and false beams (\$112,924).
   This will take eight weeks to install and will be done during the summer.
- Access through the existing attic access ladder and window on the Southwest corner of the attic is being utilized which should not require building the scaffold system and enlarging the wall louver on the North side of the Sanctuary
- We are getting a proposal from McGill Restoration to repoint the stonework at the North end of the West Truss Bearing location as it is leaking water from recent rainstorms which has caused the truss bearing deterioration that was repaired.




