# FROM THE PASTOR

If you've visited the "link", the space that connects Kountze Commons with Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church, you will have seen the new mural on the west wall. You can't miss it! It is a beautiful piece of artwork that describes our hopes and dreams for building Kountze Commons. Our three-word mission statement: *"Worship" "Grow" "Serve"* stands out, as do the symbol for the church and the symbol for Kountze Commons. To the right is a wonderful summary of what we hope takes place: *Feeding the Hungry; Healing the Sick; Tending the Soul.* 

Our summer is quickly coming to an end. As I write this, the heat outdoors is unbearable. We've had a much-needed break from the normal busy-ness of this place, but things will quickly pick up steam as the Fall schedule begins in earnest. Yet every Monday and every Thursday (with the exception of Memorial Day and July 4<sup>th</sup>) disciples of Jesus Christ have been distributing food to the hungry at our Food Pantry and healing the sick at the Weber Healing Gift Free Clinic. In the process, we to tend the soul. For some of our guests, simply being helped is uplifting; for others, being recognized as a human being by someone else is enough to carry them through the day and give them hope.

People see that we care about them. We care about them because both we and they are God's children.

And in the "old" building, things happened all summer as well. We worshiped every Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday. We baptized; we received the Lord's Supper; we celebrated marriages; we buried those who have died. LYSO and Day Camp, VBS, Bible study, fellowship times, meals ... in some ways, we were as busy as we are during the school year. We affirm that God is faithful to us day in and day out, whatever the season. God doesn't take a break from caring for us. I hope that affirmation will enlighten all of us and remind us to be faithful in worship.

Soon the Fall schedule is upon us. It will be our 161<sup>st</sup> year of ministering to the people of Omaha. We gather for worship each week as disciples of Jesus Christ and my hope is that the parking lot will be our most visible witness to who we are and what we are about. You are invited to be a part of this!

# Kountze History from the



### 158 YEARS AGO - 1861

The Daily Nebraskan Newspaper - The corner stone of the Lutheran Church was laid on Sunday, August 4, 1861. Rev. H. W. Kuhns, pastor of the church officiated at an interesting ceremonies. The Church stands upon the corner of 12th and Douglas Streets and the building will be an ornament to our city when completed. The temperature on that day was the hottest we have had this summer, and stood at 105 degrees in the shade.

### 100 YEARS AGO - 1919

After World War I, the Sanctuary of Kountze Church was refurbished at a cost of \$12,000, which included a new organ. The organ replaced the one that had been used since 1885. In 1904, it was the intention to purchase an organ for the new church building at 26th and Farnam, but after escalating costs, it was decided to use the old organ. When the new organ was installed the Council organized an Organ Recital, featuring Mr. Clarence Eddy, "America's Greatest Pipe Organist."

### 50 YEARS AGO - 1969

Under Pastor Paul deFreese's leadership, Fellowship Hall, the Sunday School, and Kitchen were enlarged at a final cost of \$597,228.

### 25 YEARS AGO -1994

"Habitat for Humanity Blitz," Pastor Johnson is coordinating a cluster of congregations to build one habitat house. Our Goal is to supply workers and to raise \$5,000. Members of this congregation are asked to give their money, their time and their skills to build this house for a family in need. To help raise funds, Kountze Kouples will hold a Garage Sale in the church parking lot and we will hold a Dessert Auction in Fellowship Hall, all proceeds to Habitat.
