FROM THE PASTOR

Practice



Ask any basketball player if s/he has a free-throw routine. If you then give the player the ball and watch you will see that s/he will come up to the line, perhaps dribble the ball three times, bend his/her knees and shoot. If s/ he were to do it again, s/he would go through the same procedure.

Now ask, *"how did you do that the same way the second time?"* You know the answer: **practice**. But why do it the same way each time s/he stepped to the foul line? Answer: going through the same motions made it more likely that s/he would score. S/he did it the same way **because it worked**.

Now think of worship. When you come to communion you pretty much do it the same way each time. Just before communion we join in the Lord's Prayer. Why is it that we know that prayer so well? Practice. Think about the practices that our faith community repeats week after week to praise God and prepare ourselves for encountering God. Worship is the place where we predictably encounter God. Like foul-shooting, we worship the way we do because it works. The Saturday evening/Sunday morning worship is a pattern of praise and encounter that the Christian community has been practicing for a very long time. God has promised to meet us in worship, and God keeps his word!

Some of our worship "practices" are better than others. Sometimes we put more of ourselves into it than at other times. This is true whether you are a pastor or a parishioner!

Worship is a regular encounter with God. We do not worship because we believe. We believe because God is regularly met in the act of communal worship and speaks to us. God has promised to be there with us always.

Can you encounter God outside of worship? Certainly. But in worship, God is present for you ... giving you his love, his forgiveness, the strength to go and serve God in your daily lives.


NEW VOLUNTEER POSSTBILTTEES As the Director of Children's Ministries, I deeply appreciate all who have considered how to help the



#### 148 YEARS AGO - 1871

Rev. Ira Billman reported that prospects are hopeful and that the ladies of the church met and organized a Working Society, the first organization of women in Emanuel's Evangelical Lutheran Church (name changed to Kountze memorial in 1883).

#### 96 YEARS AGO - 1923

LeClare Gardiner Steffan at one month old, was baptized at Kountze Church by Pastor Oliver Baltzly. LeClare is the oldest living person baptized at Kountze that is still a member. In 1937 she was confirmed at Kountze and in 1948 was married to Arnold Steffen, both by Pastor Walter Traub. Pastor Traub's daughter, Vera, was a bridesmaid in LeClare's wedding.

#### 51 YEARS AGO - 1968

For 110 years, elected Church Office Holders at Emanuel's and Kountze Church, were called Elders, Trustees, and Deacons. In 1968, under the leadership of Pastor Paul deFreese, the Elected Officers designation was changed to Council Members.

#### 25 YEARS AGO -1994

Our current organist, Mark Jones, performed a Graduate Organ Recital at Kountze Church in partial fulfillment of requirements for the Master of Music Education Degree at VanderCook College in Chicago, Illinois.
