at Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church December 4, 11, & 18 12:15 PM (with Eucharist) 6:30 PM (with Holden Evening Prayer)

In this season of Advent, we will be adding an element of guided reflections during the time for a homily/sermon for our midweek services. A guided reflection follows the ancient Christian practice of *lectio divina*. First and most commonly used in the monastery, *lectio divina* is a practice of reading a short biblical text and reflecting on its meaning in our lives. We will be aided in this process through a series of guided questions or prompts, read by the pastor, for you to prayerful consider in silence. This is a time for you to speak to God and to create space where we might here more clearly how God wishes to speak to us.



Our themes will be:

Preparation/Expectation (December 4), Repentance (December 11), and Annunciation (December 18).

We will use *Holden Evening Prayer* as a Vespers liturgy. We ask you to enter and depart the nave *in silence*, out of respectful reverence for this house of prayer and for those who have gathered early or staying later to pray. We begin worship without announcements. The lights will be dimmed and several candles lit. The mood of the midweek liturgies (at noon and in the evening) will be contemplative and reflective as we prepare for the coming of the one is "the way, the truth, and the life."

### Worship with us on TV or via Internet Livestream




Our 9:00 AM worship service is broadcast live on television every Sunday on Cox Channel 13. You can now also livestream the service right from your computer on our church


### Holiday Meal Bags for Kountze Pantry



### **Kountze History from the Archives**

October 30, 1881 - First church service held at the Boyd's Opera House. When the first church building at 12<sup>th</sup> & Douglas was sold, the new Boyd Opera House was rented for \$15 per Sunday for morning and evening services. the Opera House was built by the Omaha Mayor James Boyd at 15<sup>th</sup> & Farnam Streets and had a seating capacity of 1,700 and cost over \$100,000. At the time, it was the most premier and expensive building in Omaha. The church would hold services at this location for nearly 2½ years, until June 1, 1884, when the new church building's basement at 16<sup>th</sup> & Harney Streets was finally available for occupancy. The first service in the Sanctuary was on Easter Sunday in 1885.

# December 30, 1883 Evening Omaha Bee Newspaper The Lutheran Christmas Opera Two Hundred Children on Stage at the Boyd's Opera House Last Night

The Christmas festival of the church Sunday School of the English Lutheran Church was held on the Sabbath evening after Christmas in the Boyd's Opera House. The stage presented a beautiful sight as the curtain arose, disclosing two hundred School children. Many of the little ones were dressed in white. Upon either side of the stage stood large Christmas trees, upon which blazed several hundreds of wax tapers, while branches were filled with shining tinsels, and bent down beneigh the weight of candy and popcorn. The first part of the program was the opening exercises of the school, following which was a chant, rendered by about forty little girls, all dressed in white and in a kneeling position, and was nicely done. Then came the cantata of Doane's Messiah under the direction of prof. E.D. Bellis, in which the whole school participated. It took 40 minutes to go through with it, and each and every one who assisted in its rendition performed their part very creditably. After the cantata came songs and recitations by the little ones, and not withstanding the fact that it was Sunday night, the applause was loud and prolonged. The program was conducted by a tableau "Clinging to the Cross," after which the candy and popcorn was distributed among the little ones. The Opera House was filled, nearly 1,500 people being in attendance. A collection was taken and upon counting the spoils, the gratifying sum of \$95.15 was contributed by a generous public (\$2,364 in current dollars). The Lutherans are somewhat noted for good entertainment and last night's performance added to their previous record.



An individual age 70½ or older may distribute up to \$100,000 tax-free from his or her traditional IRAs to Kountze without including the distribution in gross income for tax purposes if certain steps are followed. The distribution must be made directly from the IRA to Kountze. Because you are not including the distribution in your gross income, you will also not include the distribution in your charitable contribution deduction.
