Advent and Christmas

We begin the Seasons of Advent and Christmas with trepidation. The pandemic is spreading more rapidly. The numbers contracting covid-19 as well as deaths are on the increase. In some ways we will have an idea what our Christmas celebrations will be like in light of our limited Thanksgiving celebrations. These are difficult days.

We have all heard the good news about progress with the vaccines. There is no quick fix to this pandemic. It will go on through this winter and spring. But there now seems to be a glimmer of hope.

The church seasons of Advent and Christmas are all about hope. A few days after Christmas is the Festival of the Holy Innocents (December 28th), when we contemplate King Herod's attempt to eradicate the new born Messiah. Matthew 2:1-18 tells this story: Herod was "greatly troubled" when astrologers from the east came asking the whereabouts of "the newborn king of the Jews," whose star they had seen. They were told that the Jewish Scriptures named Bethlehem as the place where the Messiah would be born. Herod cunningly told them to report back to him so that he could also "do him homage." They found Jesus, offered him their gifts, and warned by an angel, avoided Herod on their way home. Jesus escaped to Egypt. Herod became furious and "ordered the massacre of all the boys in Bethlehem and its vicinity two years old and under." The horror of the massacre and the devastation of the mothers and fathers led Matthew to quote Jeremiah: "A voice was heard in Ramah, sobbing and loud lamentation; Rachel weeping for her children..." (Matthew 2:18)

Herod did not succeed in eradicating Jesus. This pandemic will not either. Advent and Christmas will be different this year but they will happen. We will celebrate the birth of Jesus, perhaps seeing our need for a Savior more than ever this year. We will have four mid-week Advent Worship services:


"Adventuring into Advent"

Christmas will happen. We will celebrate the birth of our Savior.

Kountze Alternative Gifts 2020

Alternative Gifts have been a tradition at Kountze for 16 years, carrying out God's love to the world with over \$170,000 in donations. Not only does Alternative Gifts feed the hungry and heal the sick, this program also helps us to give gifts that avoid materialism and honor the true meaning of Christmas. Alternative Gifts will again be available this year during Advent, although as with most things in this time of pandemic, we will need to get creative. Instead of setting up a table in Fellowship Hall, we will take your "orders" through the mail. We will need to scale back the number of choices available to manage the workflow. The options for your gifts this year are the Kountze Pantry and the Weber Free Healing Clinic. These two have always been the most popular options in the Alternative Gift program and they are central to our mission at Kountze. 
has been reading. Best wishes for a safe Christmas and a Healthy New Year!

Kountze Commons Update

Brothers and Sisters in Faith,

This is a very exciting time for Kountze Commons, and I am writing you to share in this excitement of all that Kountze Commons has accomplished in the last few months!

Kountze Commons is working diligently to provide services to those who need it most as we navigate the COVID-19 pandemic. In order to meet the growing need and demand for services, the Kountze Food Pantry has expanded its pantry services by adding additional hours that guests can come and receive food. The expanded hours occur every Friday from 5 to 7 P.M. on top of regularly scheduled Kountze Food Pantry hours every Monday. Each week, the Kountze Food Pantry has seen an increase in people who utilize its food pantry services. When the Friday Pantry hours began, just **four** households showed up for food. Last Friday, October 23, **254 individuals** (including members of their households) were served at the Kountze Food Pantry. On Monday, October 19, **473 individuals** were served at the Kountze Food Pantry. **The Kountze Food Pantry reports serving an average of 700 to 900 people each week!**

The Del and Lou Ann Weber Healing Gift Free Clinic and Pharmacy continues its operations throughout the pandemic. When the pandemic first started, we were serving approximately 10 to 12 patients each week in person so as to keep our patients and volunteers safe. We are now serving approximately **20 patients each week** as we are slowly increasing the number of people we are serving in person. The pharmacy continues to provide medications to another **20 unique individuals** (not overlapping with patients seen at the Clinic) each week. **Total served is approximately 40 unique individuals each week**.

We continue to expand and collaborate through our partnerships to provide truly **integrated** care to those who need it most! The Kountze Food Pantry, Methodist Community Health Clinic, and the Del and Lou Ann Weber Healing Gift Free Clinic are partnering to offer FREE FLU SHOTS during the Kountze Food Pantry operation hours on Monday. We have translated these Flu Shot Notices and other associated Kountze Food Pantry and Del and Lou Ann Weber Healing Gift Free Clinic materials into Spanish so that we can also provide these crucial services to those who need it most in culturally and linguistically appropriate ways!

Finally, Kountze Commons continues to raise money for the "In the City for Good" Capital Campaign. So far, specifically the Debt Reduction Task Force and I have raised **\$268,175**, including program grants and Capital Campaign gifts! Of that total, **\$158,175** has been specifically raised for the Capital Campaign and counting!

We are anticipating approximately \$540,000 in grant funding at the end of this year into 2021 in program grant funding for Kountze Commons!

A key component of our vision is maximizing efficiency and effective use of resources by using volunteers, sharing resources, and collaborating with community partners in a community effort to serve the **whole** person.

This community effort means that Kountze Commons' partnerships are integral to sustainability of the project. Responsible stewardship of resources has been and remains a critical component of this project. The overall capital project costs are \$10,500,000. To date, over \$7,000,000 has been raised in gifts and pledges including individual and foundation support and \$2.2 million contributed from the Kountze Church Endowment. However, **\$2.7 million remains to be secured**, down from \$3.1 million at the start of this year, and is currently financed through a Mission Investment loan provided by the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America.

We are incredibly blessed to have so many people in the congregation invested in our ministries who care so deeply about the services we provide to people in Omaha who need them most. What an example of the hope of the Kingdom of God and an expression of God's love!

THANK YOU to all of our wonderful volunteers who dedicate so much of their time, resources, and for your commitment to serving those in need as the hands and feet of Christ. Your support will help ensure that Kountze Commons can continue to offer life-sustaining ministries to our brothers and sisters in need, and is an affirmation of the mission of Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church. Prepare For Year-End With A Tax-Deductible Gift

This year has been a challenging one for our congregation, especially those that work year-round on the front lines to serve our neighbors in need. As our church has stepped up to respond to rising rates of hunger and illness and unemployment, you have responded with faithfulness and generosity. Thank you so much.

We know that many of you will carefully consider your charitable giving plans as we near the end of the calendar year. This is also an important time to meaningfully support our congregation and equip us for future ministry. As you plan ways to give, we encourage you to consider opportunities that can help you make the most of new policies and your assets.



IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution

What if you could make the impact of your generosity even greater?

Writing a check might be the simplest way to make a gift. But it can also be the least tax-efficient. Even in 2020, a direct gift from your IRA might be the right tool if you're over 70½ and thinking about how to make a difference.

Why should I make a gift from my IRA? I thought I didn't have to take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) this year.

You're right – RMDs are waived this year under the provisions of the CARES Act passed in March. If you're someone who will itemize deductions, a gift of cash might be a better alternative if you don't have other assets available like appreciated stock or grain. But if you're over 70 ½ and your allowable deductions won't exceed \$13,700 if you're single, or \$27,400 for a married couple filing jointly, a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is a good option. You'll give away pre-tax dollars completely tax-free and effectively lower your IRA balance, which in turn reduces future RMDs.

How do I make a Qualified Charitable Distribution?

The first thing to remember is that the check must be written to Kountze Memorial by your investment company or bank where the IRA is held. The tax advantage will be lost if you deposit an intended QCD into your account and write a new check to the church or ministry you want to support. The maximum allowable amount is \$100,000 per year. *NOTE: A QCD will be reported as a normal distribution on IRS Form 1099-R. Be certain to provide your tax preparer with documentation of the gift from the charity for proper reporting on your tax return to avoid taxation.*

• Gifts of appreciated assets

Gifting an appreciated security directly to Kountze Memorial may allow you to maximize your gift while avoiding capital gains taxes and reducing your taxable income.

• Life-income gifts

These gifts can provide meaningful tax deductions for donors who face increased tax burdens due to income changes or other liquidity events. A life-income gift, like a charitable gift annuity, provides a tax deduction in the year it is established, partially tax-free future income and a gift to the ministries that matter the most to you.

• You can Endow your giving

• The CARES Act introduced a unique provision in 2020 allowing an individual to deduct up to 100% of their adjusted gross income (AGI) for the tax year. Did you know that you can give directly to Kountze's Endowment Fund? Most gifts to our Endowment come from bequests but the Endowment also receives gifts from living members!



New Business. Endowment grant requests: Global Mission (missionary support), Property (stained glass window repair), Media & Tech (2021 broadcast), Kountze Commons executive director position (Taylor Brown) were all approved by council.

Archives Committee Needs Your Help!

When last month's article on Sons and Daughters of Kountze Church was written it listed 24 pastors who had entered the ministry. We could not verify that Theodore Pflueger or Robert Rath had graduated from a Seminary or had been ordained. If anyone has information on these two men please notify the church office.

We also found that Rev. John K. Shirck, ordained in 1947 and the brother of Rev. Robert Shirck had not been listed. The November 1954 Newsletter indicated Kountze pastor Walter Traub preached the dedication sermon at Rev. Shirck's new beautiful \$107,000 church building, St. Mark's Lutheran Church in Des Moines, IA. This increases the Kountze total to 25 Spiritual Sons and Daughters. If you know of any others that were missed, please notify the church office.

Yule Spirit Elusive

Captain Ernest Haugse, Chaplain on Saipan, voiced the feelings of two thousand men that gathered for Christmas services in these words, "The Christmas spirit is hard to come by out here. I almost feel I might as well be celebrating the 4th of July." The men gathered to worship midst a setting of palm trees, natives, and a glaring tropical sun. The real treat of the day was a 14-inch Christmas tree received in the mail by Lt. Montana Reese of Rapid City, SD. The men streamed into his tent until late at night pleading, "Please let me smell it." Capt. Haugse was pastor of First Lutheran Church, Sioux City IA, prior to his enlistment.

Rev. Haugse was confirmed at Kountze in 1925 and was ordained in 1935. His parents, Iver and Anna Haugse celebrated their 50th Wedding Anniversary in Fellowship Hall on February 21, 1954. Iver was born in Hardenger, Norway and immigrated to America in 1899 at the age of 21. We are sure Pastor Olaf will be happy to hear this since he seems to be pretty proud that he is also a Son of Norway.

December 5, 2020 - Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church will celebrate their 162nd Anniversary

In 2013, three members of the Kountze Archive Committee visited Greensburg, Pennsylvania, the birthplace of Kountze founding pastor the Rev. Henry Welty Kuhns. While at Greensburg they spent the day researching Pastor Kuhn's family history and visited the church he grew up in, Zion's Evangelical Lutheran Church. When we entered the church vestibule it was engraved on the wall that Pastor Kuhn's parents, John and Susanna Welty Kuhns, donated the lot that the church was built on and that the Rev. Henry Welty Kuhns was ZION'S FIRST SPIRITUAL SON IN 1858.

Blessing an Advent Wreath and Christmas Tree

In the German and Scandinavian traditions of Christianity, the Advent Wreath and Christmas Tree became important symbols of the Advent and christmas Seasons. These symbols can also be important opportunities for families to pray together; to discuss the Christian message of the season, as well as to share family stories. Blessings and prayers (i.e., devituibs) around the Advent Wreath and Christmas Tree are common and available from many Lutheran resources. Here are two:

Blessing the Advent Wreath

The blessing of an Advent Wreath

takes place on the First Sunday of Advent or on the evening before the First



Sunday of Advent. All may make the sign of the cross as a parent/ leader says:

L Our help is in the name of the Lord.

Response (B) Who made heaven and earth.

Then the Scripture, Isaiah 9: (lines 1-2 and 5-6) or Isaiah 63 (lines 16-17 & 19) or Isaiah 64 (lines 2-7) is read. These readings may be done by the children.

- **L** The Word of the Lord.
- Thanks be to God.

With hands joined, a parent/leader says:

L Let us pray: Lord our God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us. he is the Savior of every nation. Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May he come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord. R Amen.

Blessing of a Christmas Tree

(Whether done on Christmas Eve or when the tree is put up earlier). With the family gathered, all may make a sign of the cross. A paren leader says:

Let us pray: 0 God,who made this holy night [or, if don before Christmas Eve: this holy season shine with the brightness of



new light. Bless this tree which we adorn with lights to honor him who comes to enlighten us. Let us see in this tree your beautiful simplicity and humble strength. Let this tree remind us of our responsibility for the care of your good earth. We ask this through Christ our Lord.
