FROM MARTIN LUTHER’S SMALL CATECHISM (1529)

The Seventh Petition:

- Ⓟ “*But deliver us from evil.*” What does this mean?
- Ⓞ **we pray in this petition, as in a summary, that our father in heaven may deliver us from all manner of evil, whether it affect body or soul, property or reputation, and that at last, when the hour of death comes, he may grant us a blessed end and graciously take us from this world of sorrow to himself in heaven.**
- Ⓟ “*Amen.*” What does this mean?
- Ⓞ **It means that I should be assured that such petitions are acceptable to our heavenly Father and are heard by him, for he himself commanded us to pray like this and promised to hear us. “Amen, Amen” means “Yes, yes, it shall be so.”**

PRAYER FROM GERMAN MASS, SAXON ANGEDA OF 1540

- Ⓟ Lord God, heavenly Father,
- Ⓞ **you know that we are set in the midst of so many and great dangers, that by reason of the frailty of our nature we cannot always stand upright: Grant us such strength and protection, to support us in all danger, and carry us through all temptations; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

PRAYERS OF THE CHURCH

(Paraphrase of the Lord's Prayer following Luther's German Mass, 1526; Luther Works, v. 53, p. 78-79)

- P** Dear friends in Christ, since we have come in the name of the Lord to [hear the gospel], I invite you to lift up your hearts to God and pray with me as Christ has taught us and graciously promised to hear us:
- P** God, *our Father in heaven*, look with mercy on us, your needy children on earth. Grant us grace, so that *your holy name be hallowed* by us and all the world, through the pure and true teaching of your Word; graciously turn from us all false doctrine and evil living, by which your precious name is being blasphemed and profaned. Lord, in your mercy,
- C Hear our prayer.**
- P** *Your kingdom come* to us and expand, that all transgressors who are blinded and bound in the devil's kingdom be brought to know Jesus Christ, your Son, by faith, and that the number of Christians may grow. Lord, in your mercy,
- C Hear our prayer.**

- P** May we be strengthened by your Spirit to *do and to respect your will*, both in life and death, in good times and bad, and always to break, slay, and sacrifice our own wills. Lord, in your mercy,
- C** **Hear our prayer.**
- P** *Give us our daily bread*, preserve us from greed and selfish cares, and help us to trust that you will provide for all our needs. Lord, in your mercy,
- C** **Hear our prayer.**
- P** *Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us*, so that our hearts may rest and rejoice in a good conscience before you, and that no sin may ever frighten or alarm us. Lord, in your mercy,
- C** **Hear our prayer.**
- P** *Lead us not into temptation* but help us by your Spirit to subdue our sinful desires, despise the sinful world and its ways. Lord, in your mercy,
- C** **Hear our prayer.**
- P** Lastly, O heavenly Father, *deliver us from all evil* of both body and soul, now and forever. Lord, in your mercy.
- C** **Hear our prayer.**
- P** We trust, O Lord, in your great mercy that you will hear and answer us; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.
- C** **Amen.**

CLOSING PRAYERS

- P** Almighty God,
- C** you have called us, your servants, to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
- P** We give thanks to you, heavenly Father,
- C** through Jesus Christ your dear Son, that you have graciously protected us today. We ask you to forgive us all our sins, where we have done wrong, and graciously to protect us tonight. Into your hands we commend ourselves: our bodies, our souls, and all that is ours. Let your holy angels be with us, so that the wicked foe may have no power over us. Amen.
- P** We are again bold enough to pray as our Lord taught us:
- C** **Our Father, who art in heaven,**
hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come,
thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread;
and forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us;
and lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory,
forever and ever. Amen.

- C** Thanks be to God.
- P** Almighty God, the Father, ✠ the Son, and the Holy Spirit, bless and preserve us.
- C** Amen.
