Worship with us on TV or via Internet Livestream




Our 9:00 AM worship service is broadcast live on television every Sunday on Cox Channel 13. You can also livestream the service right from your computer on our church

NEWS & Notes...



August 17, 2021

Motion and approval of July minutes.

Motion and approval of Financial report given by Tim Backora. July's offerings were better than June's, but expenses were also higher. Year-to-date, we are still \$40,000 in the black.

Staff reports given and approved. Pastor Olaf's last Sunday worship at KMLC will be November 14, 2021

Committee reports given. Congregational Activities is working on a possible food truck event (perhaps Table Grace). "God's Work, Our Hands" service projects are set for September 12. Global Mission is looking for additional members. Outreach has new members classes scheduled in September. Property Committee will meet Thursday to discuss possible railing near the lectern and near the choir loft. Worship & Music has not received any new volunteers and several past volunteers have retired. Youth reported their gratitude for the weeklong youth gathering, and they are planning an upcoming "lock-in".

Board reports given. Endowment Board reports that the market investments are doing well which will allow for additional grant funding in the future. deFreese Manor board reported the buyer's due diligence timeline may need to be extended beyond August 31. The Nebraska Attorney General will require a 30-day notice to ratify the purchase agreement and to amend the articles of incorporation of Kountze Memorial Inc (the owner of deFreese Manor). Notice will be given via the monthly

newsletter, email, and bulletin. Parking lot negotiations are still on-going. The Clinic board has affirmed its connection to KMLC. The Food Pantry expressed their appreciation of the Kountze community garden with their generous fresh produce. Council unanimously approved the following:

1. The Council affirms the mission of the Clinic and the Pantry as they are missions of the church. 2. The Council believes the Clinic and Pantry are worthy of funding by the Endowment and recommends their funding by endowment.

Old Business. Council Retreat will be facilitated by Mary Lee Brock. Motion and approval of the \$1,500 fee. The Kountze Commons 501(c)(3) discussions are ongoing. The proposal of a new 501(c)(3) entity that would oversee and further the mission of Kountze Commons and will remain on the agenda. The 150th anniversary of the Nebraska Synod will be celebrated on August 29th with seminarian Katie Larson serving.

New Business. General capital improvements were discussed including some needed roof repairs after the heavy rains. The wood window frames on the existing windows that are not being replaced need to be painted. Congregational Meeting is set for August 22. Agenda items are elections, constitutional by-laws, clinic update, and Pastor Olaf's retirement announcement. Council gave a unanimous thank you to outgoing council member Scott Henneman. Re-opening task force is set to meet on Thursday to discuss possible mask requirements

A thought-provoking novel of racial identity, passing, racism, spousal abuse, sexual identity, and relationships. This book was on The New York Times best selling list and received the Good Reads Award for best historical fiction in 2020.

Stella and Desiree Vignes are light skinned black twin sisters who grew up in Mallard, Louisiana, a small town composed

of light skinned black people. They ran away at age 16 in search of their identities. The sisters took different paths and lived their lives miles apart without the other half – her sister.

Stella passes for white and marries a white man and lives her life a lie with her husband and daughter not knowing the truth.

Desiree marries a lawyer, the blackest man she can find. After an abusive relationship, she returns to her home town with her daughter and remains stuck there.

There are many points of view in the story about the sisters, and later their daughters, who go in search of their true selves.

Kountze History from the



Halloween at the Kountze Sunday School

The Luther League Nebraska NOAWL Newsletter October, 1932. (Several years of these NOA WL Newsletters were donated to the Kountze Archive by former Associate Pastor Paul Moessner. They belonged to his father who was a Leaguer at Frieden's Lutheran Church in Lincoln.

"Omaha's St. Marks Luther League is trying to fmd an old vacant house with falling plaster and cobwebs lurking in the comers. Anything less and their Halloween party would be like a ghost story without a ghost." St. Mark's Church had been organized by Kountze families at 21st and Burdette Street in 1889.

"Omaha's Kountze Luther League is more lucky. The large house just west of the church, now used for Sunday School classes, is an old residence built in the gingerbread style of a past generation. Strange, steep back stairways lead to chambers tucked away in the remotest corners of the attic. In the shadow of a dying candle, every Leaguer at Kountze Halloween parties is led stealthily through the old house, until one by one, each member has been flung into a dark attic room where the ghostly shadows of other celebrating Leaguers hover in the dark. If any have survived at the end of the evening, they are carried back to air and light and offered refreshments. They go home jittering, and all 200 of them, by the time another year rolls around, they are all back for more, even boasting that very residence was once a flourishing mortuary. That fact alone, they point out makes other Halloween parties pale into insignificance."

In 1904 the property on Farnam Street between 26th and 27th Avenues was purchased for \$25,000. For many years it had been owned by the John McShane family. Mr. McShane had come to Omaha in 1874 and became one of Omaha's prominent and successful businessmen. The property had two large residences located on the west end and a large garden and flower area on the east end, where the new church was to be built. The two residences were to remain, one used as a parsonage and the other for extra Sunday School classrooms. The parsonage was only used for a short time and then used as a residence for the church sexton. Both of these residences were removed in 1941 before construction of the new Kountze Sunday School and Fellowship Hall building dedicated in 1942.

In October of 2010, the Kountze Archive Committee interviewed Walter Swanson, a long time Kountze member who

joined the Kountze mission church at 60th and Walnut Street in 1931. Walter was confirmed by Pastor Traub in 1937. He said two of his fondest childhood memories of Kountze church were on Saturday mornings when Pastor Traub would pick up the kids in his car at the mission church and take them to Kountze for confirmation class. On the way he would stop at the White Castle and buy them 25 cent hamburgers. He said that Sunday School classes at Kountze were held in the church basement, the rotunda, and the large residence next to the church. His second fondest memory was on every Halloween when the Sunday School residence was decorated by the students and turned into a scary Haunted House.

Property Committee Updates

- The recent storm exposed serious tuckpointing issues/caulking around windows, particularly on the west side of the church. The offices of Debbie Bogue and Pastor Duminy experienced significant water damage as did Sheri Tipton's apartment. We are still in the process of getting bids for repairing this damage.
- The exterior window frames of the sanctuary have all been painted by Trayco Incorporated. They also stained the wooden doors at no cost to us! Thank you!
- The A/C unit in the Fellowship Lounge has been repaired and is working properly.
- Still in progress: bids for a wooden handrail next to the Lectern and one by the short stairs leading to the Choir Loft.

Construction Loan

We currently have a construction loan with the Mission Investment Fund of the ELCA. This loan (up to \$1.5 million) was authorized by the congregation to cover the costs of the sanctuary roof repairs and the repairs to the Stained Glass Windows. As of July 31 we have borrowed a total of \$949,021 and in July we paid interest on the loan of \$3,558. We did receive an extension on our construction loan until December 2021. Until then, we pay interest only.


