The Earth wobbles. As it spins on its axis it also oscillates back and forth, changing the angle of exposure to the Sun. And so we have changing seasons – colder when our part of the world is leaning away from the sun, and warmer when we tilt toward it.

Winter isn't over yet, but spring is approaching. During winter the earth seems to be sleeping. Plants have died back or gone dormant. Deciduous trees stand bare of their leaves. But below the surface, much is happening, silently and unseen. Trees are preparing to bud. Perennial plants and bulb flowers are beginning to awaken and will soon poke through the surface.

Here at Kountze Memorial, the winter has been busy with holidays, holy days, accomplishments, and preparations. Here are just a few updates:

- The stained-glass window project is progressing. The south window is now in place in the balcony. Ronco Construction is at work preparing the opening of the east window, which will be delivered after Easter.
- The Call Committee is interviewing candidates and discerning who will be a good Senior Pastor for Kountze Memorial. Please continue to pray for their work.
- We have repaid the construction loan for the roof repair and window restoration project. The Council designated a portion of the deFreese Manor sale proceeds to pay the loan with the Mission Investment Fund, saving close to \$40,000 in interest payments.
- The new Kountze Commons Community Outreach Center has been incorporated and is preparing the application for 501(c)3 tax exempt status. This new nonprofit organization will coordinate and promote the ministries and services that are house in Kountze Commons, and work to form new partnerships for serving the people of Omaha. This is an exciting extension of our ministry to the community.

This Lent, you are invited into the spiritual practice vocare, a practice designed to help you discover and embrace various ways that God calls you in everyday life so that even amid the not yet, you can more intentionally live life on purpose for the common good.

Beginning on Ash Wednesday with a reminder of our shared, called, baptismal life and culminating on Easter Sunday with the call to practice resurrection, each week

will add a new guiding word of the vocare practice and practical ways to engage vocare in your personal life, your circle of relationships, and your congregation. You won't want to miss the chance to honor the space between no longer and not yet!"



We are in the season of Lent. As we follow the journey toward the Cross, we are reflecting on the story of Jonah in the Bible in our midweek services. On Sundays, the lectionary readings focus on how God has called others, and how God is calling us in our own time. I hope you will join us in worship, growing, and serving.

Worship with us on TV or via Internet Livestream




Our 9:00 AM worship service is broadcast live on television every Sunday on Cox Channel 13. You can also livestream the service right from your computer on our church

Like all human beings, he is prone to wander from his Creator in favor of determining the shape and scope of his own future. This temptation is especially powerful when God calls us to take on risky ventures, travel to strange places, and confront things inside of us that prevent us from seeing one another as God does. God meets us in those liminal, Lent-like spaces when we find ourselves somewhere between trust and doubt, courage and fear, anger and empathy." Join us as we explore these themes:

Sunday Focus

UNFINISHED – Discovering God's Call in Not Yet is written by Rev. Dr. Charlene Rachuy Cox and will be our focus for Sundays of Lent. She writes, "The church by its very nature, and we as people of faith, live our whole lives in the space between no longer and not yet. Cross-marked and Spirit-sealed, we dwell in the space between the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus and the final fulfillment of God's hope-filled promises. In this space between, we dwell in the unfinished as unfinished people. As John reminds us, "we are God's children now; what we will be has not yet been revealed." But we are not left alone in this space between no longer and not yet. We are not left alone to navigate this unfinished life by ourselves. God is here - present-tense, each and every day - calling to us, accompanying us, renewing and recreating us over and over again."


The KMLC Nursery is open every Sunday from 8:45 AM until 12:00 PM as well as other Occasional Special Church Services.



NEWS & Notes...



Meeting was called to order by Pastor Steve Griffith. Steve Hinrichs led a devotion. Motion and adoption of the meeting agenda by a voice vote, with two addendums to new business.

Moved and seconded to adopt minutes of previous meeting, with corrections.

Financial Report by Tim Backora: Have not received refund from IRS, hopefully approximately \$89,000. Loose offerings \$4,400 for 2022. Motion and adoption of financial report by a voice vote.

Congregational Activities Committee: Looking for a band for the Neighborhood Picnic in June.

Food Pantry: Closed MLK day and other holidays. Have continued to serve high volumes. Need more volunteers.

Property: Tim Smejkal and Mike Jensen met with the insurance company, hoping to save money in the coming year.

Social Ministry Committee: Anne will attend a meeting with LFS to assess their needs.

Stewardship Committee: Number of commitments have remained very close this year, however amounts have increased.

deFreese Manor Fund: \$1,816,664.

Pastor Hall has announced that he will begin as the Chair of Theology at Creighton University.

Staff reports received. Motion, seconded, and approved. Old Business: Update on membership audit from Pastor Shari. Have not been specific in who is participating and who is not, and have not planned for making an adjustment, are leaving the numbers the same as last year. Will say 1900 members. To work with Outreach, and will make recommendations. Discussion regarding the possible need for a more specific committee for membership, and designated people who focus on membership growth/decline, and current memberships.

New Business: Resolution authorizing Kountze Commons Community Outreach Center. Moved, seconded, and approved.

Update on budget: Revisions made to budget. Out by email to the council in the next week. Of note, worship and music will potentially be adding paid singers, thus increasing the budget. Bruce states that there has been discussion on committee of potential sign-ups/pool for singers, so that they do not have to sing each Sunday, but can be paid by the service. Concern from Steven Hinrichs regarding \$42,000 for maintenance- if this will be funded by endowment? Potential need to increase this budget.

Rev. Bob Johnson, \$2,000 gift for working with MIF to give a \$100 savings account for 20 children's baptism. Goal would be for this to be an established fund and continued.

Kountze History from the



Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church in Omaha - "A History" 1858-1990

At the May 1988 meeting the Council concurred with the Endowment Fund Committee to make a grant from the Endowment Fund to the Archive Committee for the publication of a book on the History of Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church. The Rev. Dr. L. Dale Lund was chosen to write the book. Dr. Lund, a native of Wakefield, Nebraska and a graduate of Luther College, Gustavus Adolphus College and the Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago, he was ordained in 1945. He earned a Ph.D. in Theology at Drew University. He was pastor of Immanuel Lutheran Church in Attleboro, Massachusetts, for two years before entering a lifetime ministry in higher education. He was a member of the faculty at Upsala College for eleven years, president of Bethany College for seven years, Dean of Faculty of the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago for three years and president of Midland College for thirteen years.

One page of the book lists PATRONS, those families or businesses who helped underwrite the printing of the book with a donation of \$100 or more. Early sale orders were \$10.00 and after publication were sold for

\$15.00. Pastor Wick explained that this history book reflects the strengths that each of the first thirteen senior pastors brought to the ministry of Kountze during the period from 1858 to 1990. With completion of the book, it was Pastor Wick's honor to present the first copy to the only living former senior pastor, Paul and Mina deFreese, at the Sunday Service on November 4, 1990.

The Personal Librarian by Marie Benedict and Victoria Christopher Murray



This is a best selling, notable book of the year by two female authors, one white and one black.

Belle de Costa Greene, born Belle Marion Greener, was the librarian loved by J.P. Morgan in the early 20th century. She was an extraordinary woman with intellect, wit, and style and purchased rare manuscripts for the collection of the Morgan Library and Museum in New York City, an became the first director of the library. She established herself in high society disguising her identity of being a black woman who purchased

for white, her father, Richard Greener, was the first black graduate of Harvard and advocated for equality. Belle became one of the most powerful people in the art and book worlds, and went to great lengths to preserve her white identity in the historical period she lives.

The novel is about the Morgan Collection and racial injustice.

Sunday School Good Gifts









What is the ELCA Youth Gathering?

Every three years, thousands of high school youth and their adult leaders from across the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America gather for a week of faith formation and fellowship known as the ELCA Youth Gathering. Through inspiring speakers, conversations with partners, Bible study and being immersed in the host city, young people will be inspired, challenged and called to live out their faith in their daily lives. Additionally, young people will have opportunities to explore their vocation and discern where they are being called into this world.

An essential part of the ministry of the Gathering is the two pre-events, the Multicultural Youth Leadership Event (MYLE) and the tAble. MYLE is a faith formation and leadership development event primarily for youth of color or whose primary language is not English. The tAble brings together, blesses and empowers youth living with a wide range of physical, cognitive and emotional disabilities.

The ministry of the Gathering is dreamed, planned and executed by Gathering leadership, which consists of nearly 98% volunteers and a small full-time staff out of the ELCA churchwide organization.
