This is an important, exciting time for Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church. The Call Committee, led by Deacon Jean Johnson, has recommended a candidate for Senior Pastor to the Congregational Council. Led by Vice-President Kate Jones, the Council is having conversations with the recommended candidate, and spending time in discussion and prayer among themselves. They are reviewing the ministries of Kountze Memorial, the "personality" of the congregation, and the context of the city and our surrounding neighborhood. They are considering what challenges the congregation will face in the coming years and what leadership skills will be necessary to help the congregation move forward. All this takes time, and it is natural to feel impatient when we are all eager to move to the next step. I ask you to continue to pray for the Council, for the congregation, and the pastor God is leading to us.

Meanwhile, we have work to keep doing here. Vacation Bible School is just around the corner.

Installation of the stained-glass window is scheduled to begin June 19. A special team is planning for a series of events celebrating the completion of the window in September The Nominating Committee will begin working soon to identify leaders to present for election at the Congregational Meeting on August 6. And we gather week by week to worship, to grow, and to serve. I rejoice that I can be part of all this for a short time longer.

The call committee was given the names of two candidates by Assistant to the Bishop, Greg Berger.

We received their Ministry Profiles and studied them thoroughly. We interviewed both candidates by Zoom, using questions the committee had chosen ahead of time. Both candidates were then interviewed in person. For each candidate I spent an hour driving them around the downtown area - seeing what housing is available and speaking about concerns for those who live around here. We saw all the new building, entertainment options, sports venues, etc. We went as far west as the Medical Center. The second hour we joined with Pr. Steve for a tour of the Kountze facility and Kountze Commons. Then the committee joined us and each candidate was asked another series of predetermined questions.

After each interview, the committee discussed whether the candidate would be a good fit at Kountze. We wanted a person who would be excited to grow with the congregation. We wanted a person who was familiar with the kinds of ministry that are important for a church in our location. We wanted a person who could make worship a priority, but help us grow in our faith and want to be Christian people who are open and loving to all people.

After the second interview, we let one candidate know we did not feel they were a good fit for us. At the council meeting last week, the name of one candidate who the committee voted would be a good leader for Kountze was given to the Council. The decision was a relatively quick one and definitely a unanimous vote.

Committee members are Ann Miller, Ashley Sum, Paul Revord, Mary Jo Fike, Dannika Rees, Leon Valquier, Bob Johnson and Jean Johnson.

Kountze Commons Update

Work continues on obtaining non-profit status for the ministry at Kountze Commons (the Kountze Commons Community Outreach Center). We have completed the first two phases for application to the IRS. A job description for the executive director has been approved by Council and will be posted soon. Endowment has approved a document acknowledging the new entity as entrusted with overseeing the ministry at Kountze Commons. A "memorandum of understanding" with the congregation is being drafted to clarify and affirm that the new entity exists for one purpose only: to support the ministry of Kountze Commons as defined by the congregation.

Worship with us on TV or via Internet Livestream




Our 9:00 AM worship service is broadcast live on television every Sunday on Cox Channel 13. You can also livestream the service right from your computer on our church

After the first meeting of my Lay Internship Committee last September, Liz Pemberton (Kountze member) asked if there was a specific, tangible way she could provide support this year, for me and for The Common Well — the ecumenical community of Creighton's Protestant students that I steward. Giving her full permission to decline, I said she'd be welcome to bake gluten-free treats for the student gathering that week — a practice I wouldn't have time to tend this year. Liz took that invitation and ran with it, baking and dropping off treats not just for one week but for every single week of the student gatherings this academic year. You said "yes" to a part-time arrangement because that was the need. You said "yes" to welcoming a particular intern who was juggling a complicated year of transition for her family. You said "yes" to my trying new things in music or preaching or prayer practices. Again and again, you not only said "yes". You ran with the invitation of this year. You accepted and encouraged me as your vicar, sent thoughtful cards, invited me for holiday meals. You opened your tables, your hearts and your lives, and for that I am ever grateful. Thank you for being church in your signature way — for freely and lovingly sharing Christ's love wherever you see need. I will be a better pastor for all that this year among you has held.

Immense gratitude goes to the Lay Internship Committee (Dulcinea Boesenberg — Chair, Liz Pemberton, Jacob Rump, Jenni Omann, Isaiah Spruth-Janssen & Kelly Tadeo-Orbik), to Pastor Shari who has provided endless support as internship supervisor, to Pastors Griffith and Hall for their guidance and generous colleagueship, to the whole wonderful Kountze staff, and to each and every one of you. I will hold you in my heart with gratitude for years to come.



Meeting called to order at 6:03 PM. Devotions given by Pastor Hall. Previous minutes approved as amended.

Financial Report given by Tim Backora and approved by Council. Expense exceeded income last month due in part to winter snow removal invoice and OPPD level-billing adjustment.

Staff reports given and approved by Council. Pastor Griffith discussed the Bovard Studios delay in window project completion, estimated installation is now mid-June. Council Retreat will take place on November 4, 2023 - Friday evening dinner & Saturday program.

Committee reports given and approved by Council. Kountze History from the



Life-Long Member LeClare Steffen Celebrating 100th Birthday

LeClare Steffen is the longest living baptized member of Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church.

LeClare's parents, Leo and Clara Gardiner, were active members of Kountze with her father joining in 1914 and her mother in 1921when he married Clara Petersen. LeClare was born on June 20, 1923. She was baptized at Kountze July 15, 1923 by Pastor Baltzly;



confirmed April 5, 1936 by Dr. Traub (There were 199 members in LeClare's confirmation class!); and she and her husband, Arnie Steffen, were married at Kountze on October 2, 1948 by Dr. Traub. Arnie Steffen passed away in 1997. LeClare and Arnie had two children, Jane and



Tom, who were both baptized by Dr. Traub. Tom and his family are members of Kountze, so four generations of this family have been members.

LeClare and Arnie were active members of Kountze. Arnie was an usher, was on the Church Council, served on the deFreese Manor Board, and drove the deFreese Manor van. LeClare is in Circle 4, served on the Altar Guild, and helped with Lenten dinners. They were both in couples Club, were greeters, and gave homebound communion.

During this time of window restoration in the sanctuary, it is interesting to note that in 1969 LeClare's father donated one of the stained-glass windows in the fellowship hall. It is located in Room A, on the northside of the Fellowship Hall, to the far left. The window is named "Christ in Gethsemane." Leo donated the window in memory of his wife, Clara.

When LeClare was interviewed by the Archives Committee in 2010, she had this to offer to future generations: "Kountze is the foundation of my life. I need the church and I have loved the Pastors and the lessons I have



learned at Kountze, and I want my family to continue. If young people today can stay connected to the church and believe in God, he will direct their paths through life."



This is a novel about a family living in Stung Meanchy, the largest waste dump in Cambodia. Sang Ly, her husband, KI, and sick child, Nisay Struggle to survive poverty, violent gangs, lawlessness, and attempt to pay their rent and purchase medicine to heal their ill child. They support themselves in foraging through the dump for items they can sell.

The rent collector, Sopeap, is an ill tempered woman who Sang Ly learns of her secret past that dates back to Khmer Rouge. Sopeap teaches Sang Ly to read and the momen develop

an understanding relationship. The book demonstrates the importance of literacy and how it benefits the difficult existence of human life.

The book is dedicated to the "Power of hope, dreams, and second chances."

Sunday, July 9 The Half Life of Ruby Fielding by Lydia Kang 12:15 PM




