Worship with us on TV or via Internet Livestream




Our 9:00 AM worship service is broadcast live on television every Sunday on Cox Channel 13. You can also livestream the service right from your computer on our church

Update on the Afghan Refugee Family:

I'm pleased to report that the Afghan Refugee Family we have been assisting is doing well. As you may recall, at the start of 2022, our congregation generously donated all the furniture, household supplies and associated labor to set up an apartment for a newly arrived family of 6 (which increased by 1 within a month). Several members of the Kountze Refugee Task force have continued to assist the family as they have begun to adjust to their new life here. Our support team has expanded to include people from other churches in Omaha as well.

The father in the family continues his work at Walmart and is proud to have received positive reviews and a raise from his manager. We have been able to assist two other Afghans to get jobs there as well. He is making progress in English, but working the night shift limits his availability and energy for English lessons.

Thankfully, his wife has made tremendous progress learning English. And although she never had the opportunity to learn to read or write in Pashto, her native language, she is rapidly learning to read and write English. Almost every day she sends me text messages and she proudly reads aloud simple books we get for her. She achieved another major milestone at the beginning of the summer: she passed the written portion of the driving exam on her first attempt and now has her permit. As with her husband, she was able to take a "picture test" that was designed for people who can't read English. We are now practicing driving each week. Imagine how exciting this is for someone who comes from a place where women aren't allowed to drive!

Fun activities this summer have included a trip to the zoo, a trip to the Children's Museum, two trips to swim at the Armbrust YMCA and attending the World Refugee Day and the (upcoming) Afghan-American Integration Day celebrations. Each outing requires a group of volunteers to organize, but is always very rewarding for all.

This week the two oldest boys are looking forward to returning to school to start second and first grades. The four-year old is very excited to start full day preschool at the same elementary school as his big brothers. I believe that excitement is matched by their mother's who now will only have the two little boys (ages 1 1/2 and 2 1/2) at home with her during the day.

There are still many challenges for the family, but they have made much progress. As with any family of seven, there are ongoing medical and dental issues and the occasional trip to the ER (a broken arm from falling from a tree). Other major challenges are due to the difficulties

working with government agencies and the immigration process. It has been a tremendous learning curve for all of us, but luckily, we now have an immigration attorney to advise and assist with all the paperwork.

The family is so appreciative of all the support from Kountze, but they still need our help. Some areas of need include: assistance with driving lessons or babysitting while I take the mom practice driving; assistance with English lessons; or coming over to get to know the family which helps with learning both English and our culture. Financially, the family is getting by with the dad's wages and some government assistance. However, there is no "safety net" for emergencies or extra expenses (like new winter boots for all those growing feet!). Through the Alternative Gifts program, Kountze has established an emergency fund for the family. Donations to that fund would be gratefully accepted at any time - no need to wait until Advent. Kountze maintains control over the fund and it is only used for approved expenses. Most importantly, beyond these needs, this family continues to need your prayers.

Update: Kountze Common Community Outreach Center (KCCOC)

Progress continues on our journey toward a more sustainable future for the KCCOC. Our application for 501(c)(3) status (that is, as an official non-profit entity) with the Internal Revenue Service has been completed and we are awaiting their decision. At the Congregational Meeting in August, KCCOC Board members were elected by the congregation, so that when our non-profit status comes through, the Board will be able to hit the ground running. Board members are: Class I (term expires 2024 at annual meeting): Pastor Lucy Wynard, Dale Broekemeier, Ruth Henneman; Class II (term expires at 2025 annual meeting): Tim Holland; Deb Hinrichs; Kate McCoy Jones; Class III (term expires at 2026 annual meeting): Pastor Ashley Hall; Lisa Chinn; and Jim Smejkal.

At the Congregational Council's July meeting, the provisional bylaws of KCCOC were received and a "memorandum of understanding" between the congregation and KCCOC were approved. In the middle of August, a committee of the Board reviewed applications for the Executive Director position and interviewed their top two candidates. We expect to be able to announce the new director of KCCOC soon!

Finally, the information below addresses some questions that might arise or which arose as we undertook this process. This information has been presented at various Adult Forums and in other congregational documents, but we repeat it here again.

Why was a non-profit organization necessary?

The mission of Kountze Commons will benefit from the dedicated attention of a Board

and Executive Director. The KCCOC Board is entrusted with supporting and equipping the non- proselytizing mission of the congregation and its partners at 2665 Douglas Street. To accomplish this supportive mission and to sustain communication with the congregation, the Board will be selected by the congregation at its regular annual meeting and the Executive Director will be a staff person of the congregation, reporting to the Senior Pastor and Congregational Council.

A secondary benefit to forming a non-profit organization is to aid in its effort to raise funds in support of the mission of Kountze Commons. This move is guided by the framework of our tax laws. The history and organization of Kountze Commons is unique: the mission and vision for a designated building were founded with faithfulness and funding from the congregation; yet, through an initial deposit of funds to make the project feasible, the building at 2665 Douglas Street is owned by the Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church Endowment Fund. Several grant providing organizations will not give to congregations (religious organizations that exist for proselytizing activities) nor to endowments. Therefore, to legally and effectively raise money to support the mission

of Kountze Commons, a non-profit organization to oversee the mission was formed.

KCCOC is not a secular non-profit organization

To be very clear: KCCOC has a singular fiduciary responsibility: to support and develop the Christ-centered, non-proselytizing, community-facing mission of Kountze Commons, as established by the congregation. Any claim that forming a 501(c)(3) will, by nature, remove Kountze Commons and its mission from the congregation is based on a gross misunderstanding.

There are many kinds of non-profit organizations. Some are entirely secular (with no religious affiliation) and many are historically and missionally related to religious organizations (viz., Lutheran Family Services, Camp Carol Joy Holling, Magdalene Omaha, Catholic Charities, Creighton University, and the Jewish Federation of Omaha, just to name a few local entities). KCCOC is in the second category. That is, founded by the congregation, it remains connected to Kountze Memorial not only as a vital extension of the congregation's mission but also through the selection of its Board and Executive Director, its regular reports to the Congregational Council, and that both the Senior Pastor and a representative from the Congregational Council shall serve as ex officio members of the Board. For tax exempt consideration, the primary concern is whether an entity will make its services conditional on any particular affirmation of faith. The mission and by-laws of KCCOC remain clear: "As a nonproselytizing mission of Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church, KCCOC values all people as created in the image of God and therefore does not discriminate, withhold, or exclude our services on any prohibited basis (such as creed, race, ethnicity, nationality, gender, or sexuality)."

KCCOC is not a religious non-profit organization

While honoring and acknowledging its religious foundation, KCCOC (along with its partners and programs) is directed to the needs of the people in our region without regard for their religious affiliation. Neither services nor employment are conditioned by religious affiliation. People of other religious traditions or of no particular faith affirmation are invited as valuable partners in the mission of KCCOC to "feed the hungry, heal the sick, and tend the soul."

The distinction of not being a religious non-profit organization is to help clarify how KCCOC is different from the congregation. Kountze Memorial Lutheran Church (as are other

congregations) is a religious non-profit organization in that it exists to worship, grow, and serve according to sacred Scripture, the Lutheran Confessions, and the constitution of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. These theological documents exercise a

Killers of the Flower Moon, The Osage Murders, and the Birth of the FBI by David Grann



The Osage Nation was given extremely poor land in Oklahoma to make their home. After oil was discovered beneath their land, they became very wealthy people in the 1920's. Then murders and mysterious deaths and troubled American/Indian relations began to occur to members of the Osage Tribe.

The FBI was newly created and J. Edgar Hoover was the young director. He approved Tom White, a former Texas Ranger, to lead the investigation into the chilling mystery of the Osage. A conspiracy was found to be behind the mysterious deaths of the Mollie Burkhart family and others.

This is a true story of greed, serial murders, and racial injustice. It is a frightening, not easily forgotten, account of a little known part of American history. A movie based on this book is coming to theaters in October.
