If you have been in church very long, you probably have your own associations with the word "stewardship". It's one of those churchy terms that comes loaded with baggage for some of us. But I love talking about stewardship – let me tell you why. Because stewardship for me is a shorthand way to describe the day-to-day practical side of my faith. It's what I DO with all that God has given me – my giftedness and experiences in life, my mind and my voice and my vote, my time and my finances. It feels empowering to be a steward, and I have found it to connect me to my faith in ways that make it stronger and more joyful.

This year I am looking forward to the "Stewardship Season" at Kountze because it gives me a great chance to get to know us better – as a congregation, with all our ministries and activities, and as individual disciples within this community, to learn more about what excites and motivates you to be connected here at Kountze. All year long – from Synod Assembly in June of 2023 to Synod Assembly 2024 – the Nebraska Synod, ELCA is focusing on a theme of "Go and...", which invites us all to reflect deeply and imagine what new ways of being church, here and now, might mean. You may have noticed that

the Good News each month includes a short blurb on a "Go and..." theme, questions for your reflection, and a prayer. I encourage you to take a few minutes to pause each month and engage that material. And over the next 6 weeks or so at Kountze, as you hear Stewardship Temple Talks and receive a letter from your Stewardship Team about what it means to "Go and... Be Kountze" – I invite you to pause and consider. What does it mean to you to be a part of this faith community? What more would you like it to mean? How is God calling you to engage your faith, here and now?

Thank you for being the church you are, Kountze. My family has felt your kindness, neighborliness, joy, and generosity already. We are excited to find the various ways our gifts and experiences fit in this new community. I hope you will join me this fall in reflecting together on what adventures God has for us ahead – that's what I hope our Stewardship Season is truly about.

Worship with us on TV or via Internet Livestream




Our 9:00 AM worship service is broadcast live on television every Sunday on Cox Channel 13. You can also livestream the service right from your computer on our church

Women and Gender in Luke/Acts

Led by Dulcinea Boesenberg Thursdays, October 5 to November 2 6:30-7:30 PM October 5 - Male-Female Pairs

October 5 - Male-Female Pairs in the Gospel of Luke

In the Gospel of Luke, unlike in the other Gospels, stories of men are paired with stories of women. We will consider what these pairings suggest about Luke's view of men and women.

October 12 - Women's Speech in Luke vs. Acts

In the Gospel of Luke, men speak more often than women, but women do speak. In the Acts of the Apostles, women's speech is almost nonexistent. We will consider why this might be the case and the effect of this shift.

October 19 - Women's Service and Men's Ministry

In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus comes not to be served, but to serve, and women are examples of this service. In the Acts of the Apostles, service refers to ministry and is restricted to men. We will consider why this might be the case and the effect of this shift.

October 26 - "Appropriate" Roles for Women in the Roman Empire

Though there appears to be a tightening of women's roles between the Gospel of Luke and the Acts of the Apostles, women are part of the church in Acts. We will consider how Luke presents women in roles that were considered socially appropriate in the Roman Empire.

November 2 - Marriage and Childbearing in the Roman Empire

Very few of the members of the church in Acts are said to be married, and some who are married are denigrated by comparison with those who are single. We will consider why this might be given the legal and social pressures in the Roman Empire to marry and bear children.

Meeting called to order. Previous minutes approved. Meeting agenda adopted.

Financial report for July to come in September.

Staff reports given and approved by Council. Anthony Bonacci was hired as the administrative assistant in the office. Jim Smejkal reported to Pastor Griffith that water was found in the attic, following up with Holland/other teams. More info to come.

Committee reports given and approved by Council. Congregational Activities Committee is attempting to find dates for picnic, tentatively September 24. Council Retreat will meet with Mary Lee Brock to plan. Food Pantry averaging 1,000 served per week. Global Mission Committee: Rev. Robert and Kathy Moore are going to finish in Germany; will be asking Endowment for \$5,000 to send to the American Church in Berlin; working on visibility in our community; Melissa will be stepping into a leadership role in this committee. Media & Technology: continued progress on website. Outreach Committee: two new members. Personnel did not meet. Property did not meet. Social ministry did not meet. Stewardship: will be ordering magnets, October 22nd will be commitment Sunday. Worship & Music did not meet. Window Dedication/Celebration Committee: see task force hand out; discussion of mailing postcards. Motion to approve a budget for the Window Dedication/Celebration up to \$10,000, CARRIED. Youth: see minutes, fundraisers for New Orleans Youth Gathering to come.

Board reports given and approved by Council. DeFreese Manor: identified members. Endowment: approved all grant applications (WELCA, NLOM, Table Grace); money disbursed to reimburse Pr. Lucy and family for moving costs. Medical Clinic: increase in patients; money has been moved to Dundee Bank, improved interest, money went to MIF as well. KETV did not meet. KCCOC: two candidates interviewed for ED position, goal for Pr. Wynard to meet with them before moving forward with offers.

Old Business. Motion to move commission Edie Bailey LLP to conduct a financial review, CARRIED. Motion that the Council endeavor to plan and budget for regular financial reviews every 2-4 years by an appropriate external firm, CARRIED. Installation tentatively to be the beginning of October.

The Magnificent Lives of Marjorie Post by Allison Pataki

This is the ninth novel written by best selling author, Allison Pataki. It is historical fiction about Marjorie Merriwether Post, a woman of American Royalty, becoming the wealthiest woman in the United States before she was thirty years old. She was the daughter of C. W. Post, founder of the Post Cereal Company that grew into

the General Foods empire of which Marjorie became it's leader through inheritance.

Marjorie has led an intriguing life from gluing labels on post cereal boxes as a child in Battle Creek, Illinois, a cycle of four marriages and divorces, mother of three daughters, one becoming actress Dira Merrill, wife to the Ambasador of the Soviet Union in the 1930's and acquiring a collection of Russian artwork and jewelry which was willed to the Smithsonian. She outran Natzi's in London, served soup to hungry people during The Great Depression, and greeted and hosted U. S. Presidents and their wives. This is a novel of a strong woman in American History.

New members are welcome as we "rally" into a new year of exciting reading. Reading boosts brain power. Please join us!


