

grade when she first felt a call to ministry and even younger when she decided to learn German, moved by her own heritage and her fascination with Lutheran history.

Now Bridget is excited by the Wittenberg Center's commitment to "being traditionally rooted and radically relevant." She will help facilitate seminars by a global range of Lutheran theological scholars as well as other opportunities for learning and collaboration. Because she is an ordained pastor who speaks German, she will also lead local church services on Sundays.

Very few of the members of the church in Acts are said to be married, and some who are married are denigrated by comparison with those who are single. We will consider why this might be given the legal and social pressures in the Roman Empire to marry and bear children.

unconnected youth ages 14 -26 that may have experiences in some of the following areas: aging out of foster care, homelessness, human trafficking, juvenile justice.

The purpose of this event is to provide these deserving young individuals with a warm and meaningful celebration as they transition into independent living. 
- a) set up the night before;

NEWS & Notes...



Meeting called to order at 6:00 PM. Devotions given by Tina Broekemeier. The Agenda was adopted. Previous minutes approved as amended.

Financial Report given by Tim Backora and approved by Council. Year to date income/expenses is -\$38,000. Have received a federal tax refund (covid) of \$51,000. Giving at window rededication service was approximately \$50,000. Audit will begin in late 2023.

Staff reports given and approved. Work is being done to fill the vacant Administrative Assistant. A Kountze Commons Executive Director and will start October 2 but still needs a dedicated office space. Discussion was had regarding James Holtzer call discernment and Pastor Wynard will continue to guide his discernment. Reminder: Council Retreat will take place on November 4, 2023 -Friday evening dinner & Saturday program.

Committee reports given and approved by Council. Congregation Activities has finalized plans for upcoming church picnic. Pantry demand is still high and additional volunteers are needed. Outreach noted the upcoming new member classes.

Mike Jensen, ad hoc secretary, excused from the meeting due to a prior commitment. Ann Miller assumed ad hoc secretary duties.

Old Business:

- Discussions held regarding Committee Assignments. It was determined that each council member would remain on their designated committees and Lara McCormick will replace Melissa Osentowski on Global Mission.
- Installation much discussion was held regarding the benefits of a Sunday evening service for installation so that members of the community and any other clergy could attend the service. It was decided that the installation will be held on November 21-22 at all services. The Assistant to the Bishop, who worked with our call process, will oversee the Installation. An open house will be held at a later date to welcome Pastor Lucy and give us a chance to show off Kountze Commons and our new Executive Director.

New Business:

• Associate Pastoral Transition for Pastor Duminy was officially voted on and approved unanimously. Pastor

She has been a troop coleader for the Girl Scouts for the past 9 years. She is an Omaha native. In fact, her parents were married at KMLC over 50 years ago. Her husband, Sean, is an attorney and active in the Omaha legal community, including various boards and appointments. They have three daughters, ages 13, 11, and 8. Blessing an Advent Wreath and Christmas Tree

In the German and Scandinavian traditions of Christianity, the Advent Wreath and Christmas Tree became important symbols of the Advent and christmas Seasons. These symbols can also be important opportunities for families to pray together; to discuss the Christian message of the season, as well as to share family stories. Blessings and prayers (i.e., devituibs) around the Advent Wreath and Christmas Tree are common and available from many Lutheran resources. Here are two:

Blessing the Advent Wreath

The blessing of an Advent Wreath takes place on the First Sunday of Advent or on the evening



before the First Sunday of Advent. All may make the sign of the cross as a parent/ leader says:

Our help is in the name of the Lord.

Response (
) Who made heaven and earth.

Then the Scripture, Isaiah 9: (lines 1-2 and 5-6) or Isaiah 63 (lines 16-17 & 19) or Isaiah 64 (lines 2-7) is read. These readings may be done by the children.

L The Word of the Lord.

Thanks be to God.

With hands joined, a parent/leader says:

■ Let us pray: Lord our God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, he is the Savior of every nation. Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May he come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord.

Amen.

Blessing of a Christmas Tree

(Whether done on Christmas Eve or when the tree is put up earlier). With the family gathered, all may make a sign of the cross. A paren leader says:

Let us pray: 0 God,who made this holy night [or, if done before Christmas Eve: this holy season] shine with the



brightness of new light. Bless
this tree which we adorn with
lights to honor him who comes
to enlighten us. Let us see in this
tree your beautiful simplicity and
humble strength. Let this tree
remind us of our responsibility for
the care of your good earth. We
ask this through Christ our Lord.


Confirmation Program
